Divine Mercy Sunday

In a series of revelations to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000.

The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation from Jesus can be found in her Diary entry 699:

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy."

In all, St. Faustina recorded 14 revelations from Jesus concerning His desire for this feast.

The Feast of Mercy is especially for people to be open to receive Christ's forgiveness and grace because they know that they need it so much. This Feast is for the lost, that they might be found; and for those struggling to grow in faith, hope, and love, that they might be refreshed and strengthened.

Whether we are showing mercy to the materially poor, or to the spiritually poor, we are sharing divine mercy with those whose plight is ever closer to the compassionate Heart of our Saviour.

Thanks be to God that we are invited to this great banquet of mercy on Divine Mercy Sunday!

First Millennial Saint - Carlos Acutis canonization as a Saint on Sunday, April 27, 2025

Pope Francis and the Consistory of Cardinals voted in July 2024 to approve the canonization of the first Saint from "Generation Y", those born between 1981 and 1996, commonly known as millennials.

Carlo Acutis was born May 3, 1991, in London, England though his family moved to Milan shortly after. From a young age, Carlo seemed to have a special love for God, even though his parents weren't especially devout. His mom said she had been to Mass only for her First Communion, her Confirmation, and her wedding but young Carlo's unique and unexplained devotion led to her deep conversion. The priest promoting his cause for sainthood noted that Carlo "managed to drag his relatives, his parents to Mass every day. It was not the other way around; it was not his parents bringing the little boy to Mass, but it was he who managed to get himself to Mass and to convince others to receive Communion daily." What an inspiration for a child to model faith witness to a family!

He was known for his devotion to Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions, which he catalogued on a website he designed.
